## **INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1. Find the contact information for your union to fill in the address portion of the letter. Often this can be found on mail you might have received from the union, online, or from your employer's payroll office.
- 2. Fill out the bottom portion of the form and provide enough information for the union to identify you in their records so they can process your resignation.
- 3. Sign and date the letter.
- 4. Make a copy for your records and a second copy for your payroll officer.
- 5. Mail the original to the union at the address you put on the top of the letter. We recommend sending the letter certified mail so you have proof of delivery.
- 6. Provide a copy of the letter to your employer's payroll officer.

## WHAT TO EXPECT NEXT

You should receive some acknowledgement of your resignation from the union within a few weeks.

Because dues collection is central to the union business model, you may get a sales pitch to talk you into signing up again. Sometimes the sales pitch includes untrue claims and scare tactics. Ask to have any questionable claims documented in writing.

Some unions have tricked members into signing a promise to never resign except during a small window of time. If the union claims you have signed such a form. Contact Opt Out Today for additional guidance.
